SUNDAY'S GOSPEL

Jesus appears to the disciples gathered together

While they were still talking about this, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." They were startled and frightened, thinking they saw a ghost.

Luke 24:36-37

The story begins after two men had walked along a road to a place called Emmaus. They were discussing the crucifixion of Jesus and all of the events that had taken place in the past few days. They



wondered what it all meant. As they walked, they were joined by a man on their walk. They did not recognise that the man was Jesus. There is much more to that part of the story, but it is enough for now that we know that Jesus revealed himself to them. Finally, they recognised that the man was Jesus. They were so excited to see that Jesus was alive that they jumped up and walked all the way back to Jerusalem.

The two men found Jesus' disciples and began telling them what they had seen. The Bible tells us that as they said these things, Jesus himself stood among them and said to them, "Peace be to you." Do you think the disciples felt peace? No! The Bible says that they were terrified and filled with fear, thinking that they had seen a ghost!

Once again Jesus spoke to his disciples. "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands. Look at my feet. You can see that it's really me. Touch me and make sure that I am not a ghost, because ghosts don't have bodies, as you see that I do."

Still the disciples stood in disbelief, so Jesus asked them, "Do you have anything here to eat?" They gave him a piece of fish, and he ate it as they watched. That was even further proof that they were not seeing a ghost. A ghost doesn't need food.

The disciples had seen Jesus die. They had seen him placed in a tomb. But now they saw Jesus alive. Not just this day, but for more than 40 days, they saw him and talked with him. They even watched him eat food. They were not seeing a ghost! Those same disciples went all over the world, telling the story of Jesus' crucifixion, his death, and his resurrection. They never stopped telling the story during their whole lives.

You and I have been called to tell the story just like those disciples. We must be a witness for Jesus, too. We must tell the world that Jesus is alive. © Sermon 4 Kids

FROM OUR PRINCIPAL MRS CHERYL WALSH.....

Dear Parents and Students,

What a busy but very productive term we have had. For the school administration and the Leadership Team, we have been very busy with preparing for Tier 2 which included having many aspects of the school reviewed – Child Protection, Finance, Attendance, Mission, WH&S, Staffing and Safe & Supportive Environment and Building and Premises will be in the first week of Term 2. Then on 22nd & 23rd May we have a Panel of 3 Principals, and 3 CSO Personnel spend the day in the school looking at further evidence. We have received some very good feedback from the different Reviewers on the aspects of the school that have already been reviewed.

Miss Perry, Ms Bolton and Mr Dobb will be attending the Curriculum Focus Day on 3rd May where two KLAs – Maths and Creative Arts are to be reviewed. During this time a panel will look at our student work samples, our teaching programs, assessments and Scope & sequence documents to ensure that the school is compliant.

This whole process of Tier 2 is very rigorous but does ensure that the school is compliant in all areas.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN assessments will take place from $15^{th} - 17^{th}$ May, when students from Year 3 and 5 complete Literacy and Numeracy. Parents have already received a letter from the school. Parents are reminded that they do have a choice in their child/children completing these assessments. If you do not want your child/children to complete these please contact the school so that we can give you a withdrawal form.

Year 6 Canberra Excursion

If you have any loose vouchers at home please send in next term so we can send them off to Coles.






Recycling- Return and Earn


Our school will appear in 'Nearby Locations' if you're within 10kms of the school, or search for our school by name.

When first accessing our school you will be prompted to add a student profile for your child. This allows you to make orders and payments for them. If you have made a purchase you can select our school from 'Previous Location'




