Student Representative Council

This year we have made some changes to our SRC. The change being that we will change our SRC (Student Representative Councillors) at the beginning of Term 3. This will enable more students to be involved in this ministry. It means that our students will have the opportunity to vote and choose SRC twice a year.

Swimming Carnival

Thank you to all our parents who attended and helped at our Swimming Carnival. We cannot hold these events without your support and we do greatly appreciate all you do. This year we decided to hire sections of the indoor pool and the wading pool for those students who are not confident swimmers. The students had a great time and it is something that we will endeavour to do each year. I think having buses there in the afternoon to transport the students and teachers back was also worthwhile.

Parking

Parent Information Night

Last week we held our beginning of the year Information Night for Parents. Father Greg was on hand to pray with us and meet the parents. For those parents who weren't there, we have made changes to our rewards/awards this year.

- <u>Principal Award</u> = This award is given at assembly at the teacher's discretion. These
 awards can be given for outstanding performances in either Academic, sporting or conduct. EG Public speaking, consistently doing the right thing.

St Patrick's Merit (entered on COMPASS) can be either:

- **Classroom** for effort, academic (as we previously awarded at assembly eg Great piece of writing) or attitude to work. House points automatically received.
- **Playground** Teachers on the playground give out 2 3 merits. Children are acknowledged at the end of the duty. These children are given a Raffle Ticket by their classroom teacher, which is placed in your class jar. Each Friday morning these raffle tickets are placed into a container and at line up 5 names are drawn. These children are given a token to receive a ZOOPER DOOPER from the Canteen at lunch time.

The Colour House with the most points at the end of each term is allowed to wear their House Colours to school

Gotcha= Can be awarded for Respectful, Responsible Behaviour, Academic, good manners or what the class/subject teacher would like to acknowledge.

- Token placed in class jar. EG: whole class goal of walking quietly to the classroom, being prepared for learning etc.
- **30 Gotchas in 5 weeks** = Reward chosen from Class Reward Bank e.g 10 15 mins allocated
- **60 Gotchas in 10 weeks** = Reward chosen from Class Reward Bank e.g 25 30 mins allocated.

End of year Awards – 2 x Academic, 2 x Consistent Effort and 2 x St Patrick's Spirt Award.

Admin Toilets





With the start of the new school year, 2019 Red Bus Services are introducing a new team of Driver and Customer Support Officers. These teams will be assisting students and other customers in the correct use of their opal cards as well as their correct buses and connections to deliver them with a minimum of fuss travel.

Over the past three years we have allowed the introduction of the new OPAL card system to be introduced without any hindrance or regulating of the policies, however we must now start urging the correct use of the different OPAL cards.

Last year in 2018 our data shows that less than 40% of students with the School Opal Cards were using them correctly. School Students with a School Opal Card must tap on every time they board the bus to go to/from school. If a student is not eligible for the school Opal Card then they must tap on with a Child/Youth Opal Card or pay their fare.

A NOTE FOR PARENTS

The calendar on the inside page of this document represents the chronological sequence of the programme, while the order in which sacraments should be received is provided on the front page.

YOUR PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

It is Diocesan policy that the Parish presents a family-centred catechesis for the reception of the Sacraments, and therefore parents are expected to prepare their children for their fruitful reception of the Sacraments by forming and gradually increasing within them a spirit of faith. Completion of the course also includes the following commitments:

- Parents should present their child at the Mass on the Sunday following the Parents' Education Evening to complete the enrolment process.
- Parents are to bring their child to each session, on time for its commencement,
- Parents should bring their child to Sunday Mass each week of the relevant programme.
- Parents and children need to participate in all scheduled sessions to ensure adequate preparation for the child's reception of each Sacrament.
- Parents are to bring their child to the short practise which takes place on the Sunday before the date of reception of the sacrament.

While Parish and schools will provide valuable teaching support, parents are really the ones who have most influence in preparing children and presenting them for reception of the Sacraments.

Children baptised outside this parish need to obtain their Baptismal Certificate and supply a copy to be lodged at our Parish Office.

"The initiation of Children into the Sacramental life is, for the most part, the responsibility and concern of the parents.

They are to form and gradually increase a spirit of faith in the children and, with the help of catechetical institutions, prepare them for the fruitful reception of the Sacraments of Confirmation, Reconciliation & Eucharist."



ADMINISTRATION OF MEDICATIONS IN SCHOOLS SCHOOL NEWSLETTER ITEM

The Broken Bay Diocesan Schools System 'Medication policy' and 'Administration of Medication in Schools: Guidelines and Procedures' have been revised.

St Patrick's Catholic Primary School is committed to supporting students' health and wellbeing. We require parents / carers providing the school with any relevant health information that is required to support the student at school. While this information is collected at enrolment it needs to be updated regularly, including when a new health condition develops.

Information about medically diagnosed conditions such as allergies, asthma, diabetes, epilepsy and other health conditions that may require school staff to provide support to students; (including the administration of medication – prescription or over the counter medication and the need to perform health procedures): will need to be provided to the school in writing in the form of an 'action plan' or 'health care management plan' and signed by both the parent / carer and a medical practitioner or a prescribing health practitioner. This must then be discussed with the school.

Additionally, any student health care need, action plan or health care management plan that may impact on school activities such as sports, excursions (including camps) must be provided in writing and supported by a medical practitioner / prescribing or qualified health practitioner's advice.

All Broken Bay systemic schools require medical authorisation from a prescribing medical or health practitioner to administer any medication to students (including over the counter medications such as Paracetamol, Claratyne etc).
