# FROM OUR PRINCIPAL.....

Dear Parents and students,

We have come to the end of Term 1 and it is quite remarkable how quickly the time has flown. For our new Kindergarten children it's the end of their first term of big school and they are now truly part of our school community. I am sure that they are as excited as all the other students to be starting their holidays today.

This term has seen many fundraising activities by the SRC. The money raised this term will go to Project Compassion and Caritas to support communities overseas. The school has raised over \$1,000 and we would like to thank you for your support of these initiatives.

Last week our Year 6 students moved back into their newly refurbished classrooms. The rooms look fantastic but we are still waiting to finish them off with autex lining for the back walls, blinds and new technology. Hopefully most of this will be installed over the next few weeks.

I have placed a submission with the CSO to try to secure the refurbishment of at least the Year 4 and year 5 classrooms. I will let you know if or when this submission is successful.

## **COMPASS Update**

As we continue to implement more aspects of COMPASS, we are experiencing a few problems particularly with the students on the Primary side. As a result, the gates on the **Primary side will be locked from 8.45am and unlocked again at 2.40pm**.



Students arriving late for school will need to be taken to the Office on the Infants side by their parents, to be signed in using the COMPASS Kiosk.

If a primary student needs to be collected during the day or before 2.45pm, the same procedures will apply. Parents will need to come across the bridge to the Infants side to sign their child out. We understand that this may be an inconvenience but it is essential that we lock the gates to ensure the safety of the children. We are looking at ways we can make this process easier and hope to have something in place before the end of the year. Until then this is what will be happening.

# **2019 School Concert**

Our School Concert is planned for Week 7 of Term 3 on Tuesday 3rd September. Miss Michelle will once again prepare the dance items for the concert and Mrs Morris and Mrs Howard are working on the theme, costumes etc.



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I would like to thank the parents who completed the survey after our concert in 2018 and who gave us some very valuable feedback. I would like to address some aspects of this feedback as preparation for this year's concert.

- Over 90% of parents thought the **online ticketing** was easy to use and access. There were concerns as to the increase from \$2.00 to \$5.00. The increase to \$5.00 was to cover the costs for lighting and sound. In previous years, the \$2.00 entry fee did not cover these costs.
- **Changing the night and time of the concert**. Unfortunately we cannot change the night of the concert. We are very fortunate to be able to use the hall at St Edwards and therefore we care locked into the date that the hall is free for us to hold the rehearsal and the concert. Although we do know starting the concert at 6.30pm is difficult for working parents, any later would make it too late for our students, particularly the younger students. This is why we try to give you as much notice as possible so that the working parents may be able to make other arrangements for this one night.
- **Number of seats in each row**. There were some comments that the end seats in the front rows were difficult to see the stage from. While we understand that this may be the case, we do need all the seats that were available to seat our families on the night.
- **Introducing each class**. This is something that we will try to incorporate into this year. We are also very conscious of the length of the concert and do not want to extend the time by adding unnecessary commentary.

Enrolment packages are still available from the school office for any parent who still needs one. To date we have given out over 60 enrolment packages.

# Palm Sunday – Passion Sunday

This Sunday, called Palm or Passion Sunday, is the first day of Holy Week. Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday are called the

Triduum, three days that are the highlight of the Church year. Jesus triumphant entry into Jerusalem is reported in each of the four Gospels. But in Luke's gospel there are no palms. Luke mentions only that people spread their cloaks on the road as Jesus entered Jerusalem. The cloak was the most valuable item of clothing one could possess and many people only had one cloak. In placing their cloaks on the ground before Jesus they were offering all they had to the messiah king, entrusting themselves totally to him.

On this Palm Sunday we are invited to follow the example of Jesus and empty ourselves, embracing true humility. We are invited to remove the cloaks of comfort and self-absorption to take on Christ's spirit of humility and selflessness.

Throughout Holy Week, we continue to reflect on the events of Jesus' passion and death. On Holy Thursday we reflect upon the last meal Jesus shared with his apostles. On Good Friday we remember the crucifixion and death of Jesus. As we meditate on the cross, we ask again and anew what it means to make the statement of faith that Jesus, in his obedient suffering and dying, revealed himself to us as God's Son and brought to fulfilment the Kingdom of God. Holy Saturday is a vigil where we keep watch for the expectant rising of Jesus. Easter Sunday we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. I would encourage you check the church website/bulletin for times and

to try and attend some of these ceremonies which fall in the middle weekend of the holidays.

# **Holy Week Liturgy**

Today Year 6 led us in a reverent liturgy reflecting of the events of Holy Week. They reminded us of the sacrifice Jesus made to bring salvation to all of us. Thankyou Year 6 students and teachers for bringing to life the real message of Easter.

During the term students in years 4, 5 and 6 have been attending reconciliation in preparation for the holiest of events in our church calendar; a time we turn back to God.


