Dear Parents and students,

Welcome back to Term 2! I hope that everyone had a relaxing break and a wonderful Easter, although it does seem such a long time ago now.

We have another busy term ahead with lots of things happening so can I ask that you look on the COMPASS calendar as well as our Facebook page and Compass Notifications for everything that will be happening.

Winter Uniforms

As we sent home earlier this week, children have until the beginning of Week 3 to continue wearing their full summer uniform if the weather is still warm. From 13th May all children are expected to wear their full winter uniforms.



Hair Styles

Since returning after the holidays, I have noticed a number of boys with hairstyles that are not appropriate and are not in line with our uniform/hair procedures at St Patrick's. These styles in particular are the ones where the boys have shaved half of the head and a very long fringe or other half. I would like to remind parents that boys' hairstyles should not have stripes or shaved shorter than a Number 3. Also boys hair should be no longer than collar length.




students, to sign them in at the office on the Infants side. We are working on a solution to this but it may take some time.



An Easter Breakfast

"Come and have breakfast," says the risen Jesus in John's Gospel as he builds a charcoal fire, cooks a fish breakfast on the beach for his disciples, and breaks bread with them (Jn 21:1-14). Once again, a meal becomes a powerful occasion for love, forgiveness and transformation. Jesus' attentiveness to food and mealtimes raises the possibility that our meal gatherings can be sacred times.

In families our meals together are everyday opportunities to gather and recall Jesus' presence with us. As in the Eucharist, we bring the gifts that God has given us, which have been prepared especially for our Mass, and at our family meals we share gifts that God has given to us and that we have worked together to prepare. This includes the food on the table and also the people who gather around the table. We ask God to bless these gifts and to be present among us in all of our interactions.

A wonderful way to put the living Christ at the centre of our homes is to make the most of family meals, giving thanks as we break bread together. As we break bread together let us not forget those people who no longer have the opportunity to celebrate with their families. We remember those who were affected by the Christchurch massacre where 50 Muslims were murdered; the 250 people celebrating the resurrection in Masses in Sri Lanka on Easter Sunday and those murdered and injured at a synagogue in San Diego on Saturday as worshippers celebrated the last day of Passover. We pray for all who have lost loved ones or have been injured while exercising their human right to cel-

ebrate their religion.

On Monday we joined the SRC as they reminded us all about th sacrifices made by our service men and women ,both past and present through our celebration of the ANZAC liturgy. Thank you to those students and to our Year 3 Teachers for preparing such a moving and thought provoking liturgy.

A reminder that the gates on the **Primary side will be locked from 8.45am and unlocked again at 2.40pm**.


Students arriving late for school will need to be taken to the Office on the Infants side by their parents, to be signed in using the COMPASS Kiosk.


