FROM OUR PRINCIPAL......

Dear Parents and students,

His week we had our first pop-up playground and it was great to see 18 families at school on Monday morning. We have another one on Wednesday 5th June from 9 - 10.30am and three more next term -1st, 16th and 28 August. If you have preschool aged children and would like to join us please feel free to come along.

P & F Meeting

On Thursday 6th June at 7pm in the LARC, is our next Parents and Friends Meeting. It is important that our parents support this by attending. We only have one meeting a term so please join us.

Afternoon Pick-up

Each afternoon on the Infants side we have over 20 buses that our children need to catch as well as students who are picked up by their parents. Our procedure in the afternoon is that we keep the children on the playground and we have Year 6 runners who go in to call the bus number as it arrives.

As you can imagine, it is quite congested out the front of the school and in the driveway. Can I ask if parents wouldn't mind moving to inside the playground to collect their children or away from the driveway area. Thank you for your understanding of our safety concerns.

Kindergarten 2020

At present I am about half way through enrolment interviews for Kindergarten next year. If there is still anyone who has not returned their enrolment form can you please do this ASAP. We have over 50 enrolment applications already, which is wonderful.

Primary side late arrivals and early pick up

As previously corresponded to parents, the COMPASS APP, is not recording accurately late arrivals or early pickup.

Any student, who arrives after the second bell in the morning at 8.40am, is required to be entered as a late arrival. Parents need to do this through the KIOSK on the Infants side. Even if the gates on both Campuses have not been locked, students arriving late need to be signed in by parents on the Infants side. I am asking for parents to please do this.

If you need to collect your child earlier than the afternoon bell, you will also need to come to the Infants side to sign your child out.

We understand that this is inconvenient but until I can get a KIOSK on the Primary side and the gates locked differently, this is what needs to happen. Once again, thank you for understanding our safety concerns.



FROM OUR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION CO-ORDINATOR MS FIONA BOLTON....

This week we celebrated National Reconciliation.

National Reconciliation Week is a time for all Australians.

The theme for this year is:

"Grounded in Truth: Walk Together in Courage"





At the heart of reconciliation is the relationship between the broader Australian community and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. To foster positive race relations, our relationship must be grounded in a foundation of truth.

Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples have long called for a comprehensive process of truth-telling about Australia's colonial history. Our nation's past is reflected in the present, and will continue to play out in future unless we heal historical wounds.

Through the study of the the history of Australia both past and present in our History units, our students learn about our shared histories, cultures, and achievements, and explore how each of us can contribute to achieving reconciliation in Australia. Specifically in Year 6 the students examine and reflect upon two significant milestones in the reconciliation journey— the successful 1967 referendum, and the High Court Mabo decision.

Many classes incorporated this theme into their Religious Education units as they examine the meaning of reconciliation as preached by Jesus. Jesus states that Reconciliation must live in the hearts, minds and actions of all so that, as Australians, we can move forward, creating a nation strengthened by respectful relationships between the wider Australian community, and Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. This National Reconciliation Week invites all Australians from all backgrounds to contribute to our national movement towards a unified future.

Confirmation Ceremony

Congratulations to all our students who will be making their confirmation on Sunday. There will be two sessions on this day. The first will be at 9.00 mass and the second will be held at an 11.30 mass.

Reconciliation Classes

Preparation classes for the sacrament of Reconciliation will begin early next term. Enrolment forms will be sent out this week to the year 3 students and others wishing to make this sacrament. They are also available on the church website or at the church foyer. There is an obligatory parent education session on Wednesday 24th July at 7.30 in the church.





2019 INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS AND ASSESSMENTS FOR SCHOOLS (ICAS)

This year we are once again offering your children the opportunity to take part in International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS) testing. For over 35 years, ICAS has taken place annually in schools throughout Australia, New Zealand, Hong Kong, Singapore, Malaysia, Brunei, the Pacific Region and South Africa. Your child is invited to participate in ICAS in 2019.

ICAS provides an opportunity for all students in Years 3 to 12 to gain a measure of their own achievement in an external testing situation. It provides parents and students with comprehensive reporting of results in the areas of Computer Skills, English, Mathematics, Science, Spelling and Writing.

All students receive a **certificate** and an **individual student report** indicating which questions they answered correctly and their score compared with the rest of the students tested.

Certificates are awarded for each year level as follows:

- High Distinction to the top 1% of entrants
- Distinction to the next 10% of entrants
- Credit to the next 25% of entrants
- Participation to all other participating students.

If you wish your child/children to participate please login to Qkr! and pay the entry fee by **Friday 2nd August.**

Each test costs \$14.50 and they will be held on the following dates:

Digital Technologies - 3rd September Science - 5th September Writing - 10th September Spelling Bee - 12th September English - 17th September Mathematics - 19th September

Choose water as a drink

Did you know?

- Children and teenagers who regularly drink soft drinks and other sweetened drinks are more likely to be overweight.
- ★ In NSW, 55% of boys and almost 40% of girls in Year 6 drink more than one cup of soft drink every day. By Year 8, these figures rise to almost 60% of boys and more than 40% of girls.

Water

Drinking water is the best way to quench your thirst. Even better, it doesn't come with all the sugar and energy (kilojoules) found in fruit juice drinks, soft drinks, sports drinks and flavoured mineral waters.

Drinking water instead of sweetened drinks may also prevent dental problems, while the fluoride found in tap water can help strengthen teeth and bones.

Milk

Milk is a nutritious drink for kids and teens and a great source of calcium, which is important for growing strong bones and teeth.

From 2 years of age, children should drink reduced fat milk. It contains much the same nutrients as full cream milk but is lower in unhealthy saturated fats and lower in energy (kilojoules).

Children under 2 years of age should not drink reduced fat milk as they need the extra energy (kilojoules) for their growth and development.



Fruit juice

Giving kids and teens whole fruit to eat is a better choice than offering fruit juice to drink.

While whole fruit contains some natural sugars that make it taste sweet, it also has lots of vitamins, minerals and fibre, which makes it more filling and nutritious than a glass of fruit juice.

One small glass of juice provides a child's recommended daily amount of vitamin C. Unfortunately, many children regularly drink large amounts of juice and this can contribute to them putting on excess weight.


