Sacramental Program

Celebrating the 60th Anniversary of St Patrick's School and the 55th Anniversary of the Parish

This year we have two very important anniversaries to celebrate -

The 60th Anniversary of the School The 55th Anniversary of the Parish

On Sunday 15th March there is a special mass at 10.30 which all families are invited to attend. Our new Diocesan Bishop, Bishop Anthony Randazzo will be celebrating Mass and this is a great opportunity for families to meet our new Bishop.

Following Mass there will be activities in the playground which include performances by the students, a mini fete, sausage sizzle etc. It is looking to be a very exciting day for everyone.

On Tuesday 17th March the school will celebrate St Patrick's Day with a whole school Mass and a fundraising activity. The P & F have booked 'Obstacool' an inflatable obstacle course for the students.

We are very lucky that one of our families has generously donated the cost for this, which means that all funds raised will go to the School/P & F. St Edward's College is also allowing us to hold this event on their oval. It will be a great day of fun for the students.

We have been listening to our students and parents and all money raised will go to make improvements to the two playgrounds. This will be a very expensive process so it may take us a couple of years to do this. We would like to see how we can improve the Primary play-

ground by adding games, hopefully a rock garden and possibly a fort of some type. The infants playground needs some new Softfall and games as well. These are just a few ideas we have having been thinking about but nothing is set as yet.

Classroom Refurbishment and Local Schools Federal Government Grant

Last year I applied for a Federal Government Grant to help with the refurbishment of some of the classrooms. I am very pleased to announce that we were successful and received a \$20,000 grant to add to the cost of the refurbishments.

The Catholic Schools Office (CSO) has approved the refurbishment of the next four classrooms - Years 4 and 5 rooms and work on these rooms will commence in April. This is a significant upgrade for the school. Hopefully the last classrooms on the Primary side will also be refurbished before the end of this year.

Primary side gates

We are still working on the gate situation on the Primary side. Although the CSO has given me the 'go ahead', I am still waiting on the contractor to begin work. So hopefully you will see some changes before the end of the year.



Encouraging Persistent Maintaining Challenge (EPMC) for Mathematics

Last year the school began our journey with EPMC and the teachers were involved in professional learning based on 'Exploring the Potential of using Challenge Mathematical Tasks'. This year we will continue our professional learning for EPMC. The teachers will be involved in Geometric Reasoning. This professional learning is part of our SIP -School Improvement Plan for Teaching and Learning.



'The Resilient Child' Workshops

We have a Resilience Workshop for Parents early next month which is a great opportunity for parents to hear some valuable information. The workshops will give information about how parents can help children develop their resilience and cope better with the ups and downs of school life.

We have on session on Tuesday 3^{rd} March from 9-10.30am and a repeat session on Thursday night 12^{th} March from 6.30-8pm. We can have baby-sitting available if we have enough parents who wish to attend and take us up on this service. Please see the flyer included in the newsletter.

Kindergarten 2021

Information Sessions for students who are eligible to commence Kindergarten in 2021 will be held next month. There is one Session on 26th March at with tours at 9am followed by an information session at 9.30am and a repeat session on Monday 30th March commencing at 6.30pm for tours and 7.30pm for the information session.






P&F news





The calendar on the inside page of this document represents the chronological sequence of the programme, while the order in which sacraments should be received is provided on the front page.

YOUR PARENTAL RESPONSIBILITY

It is Diocesan policy that the Parish presents a lamily-centred catechesis for the reception of the Sacruments, and therefore parents are expected to propare their children for their fruitful recoption of the Sacraments by forming and gradually increasing within them a spirit of faith. Completion of the course also includes the following commitments:

- Parents should present their child at the Mass on the Sunday following the Parents' Education Evening to complete the enrolment process.
- Parents are to bring their child to each session, on time for its commencement.
- Parents should bring their child to Sunday Mass each week of the relevant programme.
- Parents and children need to participate in all scheduled sessions to ensure adequate preparation for the child's reception of each Sacrament.
- Parents are to bring their child to the short practise which takes place on the Sunday before the date of reception of the sacrament-

While Parish and schools will provide valuable teaching support, parents are really the ones who have most influence in preparing children and presenting them for reception of the Sacraments

Children baptised outside this parish need to obtain their Baptismal Certificate and supply a copy to be lodged at our Parish Office.

"The initiation of Children into the Sacramenta! life is. for the most part, the responsibility and concern of the parents.

They are to form and gradually increase a spirit of faith in the children and, with the help of catechetical institutions, prepare them for the fruitful reception of the Sacraments of Confirmation, Reconciliation & Eucharist."
