FROM OUR PRINCIPAL Mrs Cheryl Walsh.....

Dear Parents and students,

Welcome back to Term 2.

As you are aware the Government announced last week a staged return to school for students in NSW schools during COvid-19. As previously stated this model will see students returning to face-to-face teaching one day per week from the beginning of Week 3 Monday 11th May. Then hopefully a gradual return to full time school. This of course will all depend on health advice and further Government and CSO decisions.

Only the Melbourne Street (Infants Campus) will be open during this time.

- Weeks 1 and 2 are Phase 0 School is open for students of essential workers who need to attend work. Next week is the same as this week.
- Weeks 3 and 4 are Phase 1 School is open one day per week for students and students of essential workers who need to attend work.
- Week 5 onwards is yet to be confirmed.

This plan is phased, and flexible, allowing us to slowly bring schools back to normal while responding quickly if new spikes in transmission occur.

Why are we doing a phased approach?

Maintaining the health and wellbeing of our staff, students and school community is of utmost importance. We will therefore have the students return to school one day per week using the Colour Houses.

This means we will have approximately 85 – 95 students per day as well as the children of essential workers if they need to attend. Our families will also be accommodated by only having to come on one day in the week. A phased approach will mean there are a smaller number of students at school each day, providing more space to spread out. It also helps to balance the varied needs of students and staff, their families, personal circumstances and workplaces.

The flexibility of the approach means we can also respond quickly to any new spikes in the spread of COVID-19. During weeks 3 and 4 we will still only have the Infants side open.

Below are the plans for the management of the school community during Weeks 3 and 4, and staggered drop-off and pick-up of children among other details from Melbourne Street Campus.

Students will need to bring with them on the day they attend

- The workbook they have been using for HBL
- Their pencil case with pencils and pens etc
- Their head phones

I understand that the above arrangement may not correspond with the most suitable day for your family or work arrangements, but I ask that parents and carers support this model. This will allow the school to plan more accurately for the number of students requiring care and supervision on each day.

School drop off and pickup to be staggered

To minimise adult contact, we ask that parents and carers support our staggered school drop offs and pickups. We will have three drop off and pick up times during Weeks 3 and 4 at our Melbourne Street Campus

In the mornings families whose surname

begins with the letters	A – H are asked to be dropped off at 8.20am.
begins with	I – P at 8.30am
begins with	Q – Z at 8.40am.

In the afternoon families with surname

begins with	A – H are asked to collect your children at 2.30pm .
begins with	I – P at 2.40pm
begins with	Q – Z at 2.50pm.

Children who catch buses home will be supervised until the buses arrive.



Parents are reminded that they are not allowed on the school playground because of social distancing

- In the morning your children will be met at the side gate at 8.20am and told which classroom to go to.
- In the afternoon students will be brought down to the side gate so that they can be collected.

Essential Workers

Parents who are essential workers and who are sending students to school on other days are asked to complete the google form <u>https://forms.gle/HC9Wu2ad547UJJJh9</u> so that we can organise supervision for them.

Student Learning

- During this time the Home-based Learning Program will continue as it has been whether the students are at school or at home.
- The day your child/children attend school they will engage with a grade teacher face to face as well as work on HBL.
- Students of essential workers who attend more than one day, will only have face to face teaching on one day. On the other days they will be supervised to complete the HBL activities.
- After consultation with parents, students and teachers, Friday will remain as 'Catch up Friday'.

We will follow the schedule that is on the school website on the face to face teaching days.

Submitting Work

Students who are completing tasks online are required to submit tasks completed regularly. This will allow enough time for teachers to review student work and provide feedback in a timely manner.

Parents are advised to leave tasks if they are too difficult to complete or family situations make it unmanageable.

Please understand that the requirements for student attendance has changed in recent weeks from what was first announced by the Premier Gladys Berejiklian. We expect that the NSW Government may present more changes to requirements for student attendance in the coming weeks. This will mean we may need to adjust our plan to ac-

"Start where you are

Use what you have

Do what you can"

Asher Ashe

I have always loved this quote by Arthur Ashe and especially now, I think it has great significance as we face these uncertain times together.

In this week's gospel from St John, the 4th Sunday of Easter, we hear that in the most difficult challenges of our lives — COVID-19 included — Christ the Good Shepherd speaks amid the turmoil and fear. If we listen with open hearts, we can hear Christ speaking in those small acts of kindness, forgiveness and justice that eventually get us beyond those obstacles.

The month of May is the month of Mary. Many great popes, saints, and Christian leaders have exhorted us to pray the rosary. It is a powerful prayer that can change your life, strengthen the family and bring peace to the world in a time of crisis. As we cannot attend church, we may like to find time to pray Mary's Prayer "The Rosary" with our children. Traditionally at school we would say one decade of the rosary every morning. You might like to do the same.

Many of you may have heard of a practice initiated by Sir Anthony Sheldon called "The Daily Pause". The Daily Pause" is a moment to practise being calm and to reflect on what's happening and how we're feeling. Many of us may be experiencing anxiety and fear at the moment, but there are also feelings of solidarity, hope and gratitude - especially for all those doing so much to help others.

The Daily Pause involves taking 2 minutes at 8.00am every day to practice being calm and still. It can help us to accept what we cannot change, be grateful for what we have and take action to help make things better. Maybe saying a decade of the rosary becomes part of your daily pause.

Any of these practices may help you "Keep calm, stay wise, Be kind" especially for our children's sake.
