FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have made it to the end of the term! This term has been a very difficult one for everyone and although things appear to be improving in the world, we have seen how quickly they can change.

Pupil Free Day Friday 3 July

No supervision for students

We are still finding out how things will change for next term. For example, if our Athletics Carnival goes ahead, it will be very different to previous years. We have school photos planned but they also will be different. At present there can still be no group photos at all. We have been able to move the Year 5 and Year 6 Overnight excursions to term 4 but they still may not be able to go ahead as we have to follow the guidelines from the Catholic Schools Office, not just the Government. We will continue to keep you updated on all these issues as soon as we know.

Family Surveys

Earlier this term the Catholic Schools Office sent home an online survey to all parents. We received the results of this survey last week. We had 119 responses to the survey and a Net Promoter Score of 34. The Net Promoter Score is determined by subtracting the 'Detractors' from the 'Promoters'. The score of 34 was very good based on the following scale:

0+ is good 50+ is excellent 70+ is world class

There were two main aspects to the survey –

- The school's response to COVID-19, Home based Learning, returning to face to face, etc
- How likely are you to recommend St Patrick's?

The responses to Part 1 were overwhelmingly positive with the majority of parents either strongly agreeing or agreeing with the statements. The responses to Part 2 were also overwhelmingly positive with 98.6% confidence in the school.

The majority of parents expressed their thanks to the school and the teachers eg: 'It's a great school. I'm happy I sent my kids there.'

'beautiful school, beautiful and loving staff and principal who knows every child'.

'St Patrick's have a fantastic culture. Teachers and staff display genuine love, care and empathy. They went above and beyond; I feel blessed at being part of this community!'

There were many more positive comments which I am happy to share with anyone who is interested.



There were also some concerns that parents raised which I would like to respond to around technology, before and after school care, Kiss 'n' drop, parking, nothing is being done at the school and the canteen.

The school on a number of occasions has investigated with the Gosford Council the possibility of a kiss 'n' drop for both sides. We have also spoken to them about the lack of parking. Unfortunately, the Council has advised that there is no where we can have a kiss 'n' drop on either campus because of our location to the main roads/streets. We even tried to see if we could have something implemented in the area in front of the Admin/Infants but we can't because of the pedestrian crossing and the bus stop. We have approximately 20 buses each day that drop off and/or pick up students. Our playgrounds certainly don't allow for the possibility of a kiss 'n' drop here either.

As for the parking, unfortunately there are two high schools and two primary schools as well as a pre-school all in close proximity. The are many Year 11 and 12 students who also drive and there is no off-street parking for the staff at St Patrick's. On top of this when housing developments are approved by the council, there is no consideration for what already exists in the area. By this I mean that when a housing block is used to build town houses, there is only one parking space provided when in actual fact each household could have two cars (as is the case in many families). This means that the surrounding streets are used to park extra cars. If anyone has any solutions to these problems I am more than happy to meet with you so we can see what can be done.

I understand that some parents have raised the times that OOSH operates. As this is not operated by the school we don't have any control over the hours, however I am happy to contact CatholicCare about your concerns to see if any changes can be made.

I would like to expand on the 'amount of technology', 'nothing being done in the school' and 'the canteen'. When I arrived in 2016, there were some chromebooks and a few IPads, some IWBs and teacher laptops. We now have at least 15 Ipads in each classroom, a teacher Ipad and laptop, and a bank of 32 laptops in the LARC for student use. There are IWB's or Interactive data projectors in all I nfants classes and on the primary side there are two TVs in the Years 4 – 6 rooms and IWB's in Year 3. All the classrooms have been air-conditioned and the 4-6 classrooms as well as the Primary Canteen have been refurbished. The increase in technology, the air conditioning and the canteen refurbishment were supported by you, the parents, through the many fundraising activities, the P & F levy and the canteen. The canteen is operated purely by volunteers and the profits go back into the school. In the past there has been a paid canteen person but unfortunately the cost of this outweighed the money coming into the canteen. An outside operator would increase the cost of the items, would still need parent volunteers and then there would be no profits coming into the school.

Over the past 5 years I have endeavoured to make a number of changes to things at school. This includes the physical aspect, facilities as well as to policies, particularly our Behaviour Management Policy and curriculum. I am more than happy to meet with any parent who would like to address a comment they made in the survey or if you have any concerns at all. Please contact the office so an appointment can be organised.

Kindergarten enrolments 2021

We currently have 65 enrolment applications for Kindergarten in 2021. Obviously, this is too many for next year and this number has exceeded our expectations. We are currently in the process of going through the enrolments and will be in touch with families shortly.

Approaching other children in the playground when something goes wrong in friendships

Quite often our children get into friendship issues at school. This can be a simple thing or at times quite complex. My advice to parents, depending on the age of the children and the circumstance, is to let the children sort it out.



There are times however, that you need to be involved and that's when parents should contact the class teacher so we can investigate and find out what's happening. It is never appropriate for a parent to address another child. This can cause more difficulties for the children involved, especially when they sort things out themselves and it is also a Child Protection Issue. Please contact the school office is you have any concerns about issues such as these so that we can investigate appropriately.

Dogs on the Playground

I know times at the moment are very different but I would like to remind parents that dogs are not allowed onto the school grounds. This is not only a safety issue but also something that we need to consider for students who are highly allergic or anxious.

Semester 1 Reports will be sent home next Friday. Parents will be notified that they are available for you on COMPASS. Hard copies are no longer sent home.

I am hoping to have an update for parents about what Term 3 will look like for us. By this I mean, drop off and pickups, assemblies, parent volunteers etc.






FROM THE LADIES OF THE OFFICE...







