#### **Caesar and God**

"Give back Caesar's things to Caesar, and God's things to God." In Sunday's gospel we read the now famous response of Jesus to the Pharisees who never missed an opportunity to try and trap Jesus. They were always hoping that he would say or doing something that would make him look foolish in front of his friends and followers especially regarding the Jewish obligations under Roman Rule. In this case the payment of a head tax was necessary if the Jews were to live in relative peace with their Roman overlords. The text has been used, over time, as a basis for separating Church and state but Matthew's use was much more or"Render therefore unto Caesar the things which are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's." Matthew 22:21



dinary. He wanted to show Jesus' astuteness and his ability to use their own arguments to counter the discrediting tactics of the opposition. The second point is much more important. It is about how a disciple lives in a world which does not put the things of God first. What are the things of "Caesar"? What is the legitimate use of power? What are the things of God?

Perhaps we need take some time this week to reflect on our daily lives to discover what is truly and deeply essential to us. According to Jesus and the gospel what is essential is love, for-giveness, peace, justice and concern for the poor. As we do this, may the words of Jesus from Sunday's gospel stay with us; *give to Caesar what is due to Caesar and give to God what is due to God.*
