The \$300 sustainability grant that I applied for has come through. Mrs Bolton will use this, perhaps next year, to maintain the primary vegetable garden.

Principal's Report Term 4

The term has certainly been busy for everyone. We have just received our final staffing for 2020 which has given us an extra teacher for 2020 with three Kindergarten classes. We have sent out over 70 acceptance letters for Kindergarten and have held over 80 interviews. All this without any information nights or school tours. We also have a few students commencing in the other grades, which means we have at present 303 students next year.

I have put forward three options for the CSO. One has been agreed in theory as the best option. This option involves halving the Infants library with a bi-folding glass door. Then moving the entrance of the new library and building an additional teacher resource area. The total cost of this is approximately \$100 000.00 and the school would need the support of the CSO to do part of this project.

The CSO is still going through a major re-structure. There is new branding and we are now called CCBB – Catholic Schools Broken Bay. The re-structure has resulted in a number of job loses/resignations in the office, with one significant change for school support being the loss of the school consultant roles. The CCBB re-structure is continuing and all parish priests have been briefed. The re-structure has also impacted on schools quite significantly in many ways. All schools are trying to work through these difficulties. The CCBB has given significant fee relief for families over the past two terms and this will continue into next year.

The process for Leadership Positions is also different from this year. Anyone wishing to apply for a position had to have their application in a few weeks ago, for any possible positions that arise. If a position comes up and an application has not already been submitted, a person can no longer apply for this position. We are in the process of choosing a new Assistant Principal to replace Michelle Perry as she leaves to take up a new position at OLR Wyoming.

Our Year 6 Graduation celebration year will be very different. I am waiting to discuss with Father Greg how we will do this this year.

CSNSW released information about parents being allowed back on the school grounds. I have clarified with CCBB, who have said that this is only out of school hours and social distancing still needs to be followed. So our Graduation celebration is restricted to the number we can have in the church.

Our Kindergarten Transition Program has started but children only are allowed on the school site not parents. I am giving parents 'take home' information each week and offering one of two zoom sessions on a Monday afternoon/evening.

With the cancellation of the two overnight camps for Years 5 and 6, the teachers are organising virtual or different opportunities. Year 6 have five days of virtual and face to face speakers and other activities.

Year 5 have organised 3 days of leadership activities for the students. This is to replace their Leadership Camp. Yesterday we had a Ninja Warrior Session for the students.

Although we were not able to have our Athletics Carnival as planned, the teachers each week took the students down to the park to make up for not being able to hold the carnival as usually planned. This has enabled us to still have age champions etc.

We are having our Swimming Carnival for next year next week, which needs to be run without parent helpers. We are doing this with swimmers only attending and in two sessions – Juniors and Seniors.

I have been able to organise the OBSTACOOL for Monday 30th November and this will be held at St Edward's on their oval.
