Space/Smart Watches and Mobile Phones

I understand that some parents wish their children to be able to contact them in case of an emergency and that there is a need for space/smart watches and mobile phones in some cases. We don't encourage students having these devices at school for a number of reasons. These reasons include the privacy of other students, the improper use of social media platforms etc.

I would encourage parents to think if it is really necessary for their child to have one of these devices while in primary school.

Our School Procedures for the use of these items are as follows:

- Students are not allowed to look at or use space/smart watches or mobile phones during the school day. Primary students are given time in the afternoon when lining up to check their phones to see if there are any messages.
- All students are to keep their phones in their bags while on bus/walkers lines. Once they are on their bus then they can take them out again.
- Parents should contact the school office if they have important information/messages for their children. This will be passed onto the class teacher and given to the children.
- Parents are asked not to call their children on their phones/watches once they are at school and on the playground.
- Students should not be contacting parents via these devices during the school day. Please do not encourage your child to do this but to speak with the class teacher about what's troubling them, that's what we are here for.
- Students seen using their space/phone watches or mobile phones during the school day will be given a warning. On the second occasion the watch/phone will be taken by the teacher and returned at the end of the day to the students. On third or subsequent occasions the watch or phone will need to be collected from the Principal.

The school takes no responsibility for any lost or damaged space/smart watch or mobile phone.

What is your goal time-frame? An end-date can help provide motivation and help you prioritise your goals.



CONFIRMATION 2021: SUNDAY JUNE 5

Due to changes made by Bishop Randazzo in 2020 to the eligible ages of candidates for the Sacramental programs from 2021, Confirmation is now offered to children in Year 3, and 1st Reconciliation and 1st Eucharist to children in Year 4.

This means then that our 2020 Year 2's who missed out last year will now be eligible this year.

As last year's Year 3's have already received the Sacraments of 1st Reconciliation & 1st Eucharist in 2020, those Sacramental programs will not now be available until 2022 for Yr 4 students.

Applications for Confirmation 2021 will be available from the weekend of February 20/21 via many platforms. Enrolments will close on Monday March 29.

Stations of the Cross at St Pats church each Friday at 11.30am prior to the midday Mass







Is your child interested in learning an instrument?

The School Band program is an excellent opportunity for them to learn the instrument of their choice in a fun, engaging and affordable way. Music education has been shown to have enormous academic and social benefits for children and is a skill that they can keep with them for life.

We are currently inviting students to join the Training Band for 2021 and have visited your child's class this week to talk to them about the band program and about the different instruments that are available to play.

In summary, the band program consists of:

- A weekly band rehearsal held either before school or during lunch time (depending on the school)
- A weekly small group tutorial with a specialist teacher on the instrument of their choice, held during the school day at school.
- Students can choose from the following instruments:
 - o Flute, Clarinet, Alto Saxophone, Trumpet, Trombone, Euphonium/Baritone or Drums (limit of two drum students per training band)
- Cost is approx. \$200 per term (2021 fees yet to be finalised)
- Instrument Hire (optional) between \$65 to \$70 per term.


