Dear Parents and Carers,

### **ANZAC Day**

Next Sunday we celebrate ANZAC Day. We will be having an ANZAC remembrance ceremony on Tuesday 27<sup>th</sup> April at 11.30am. All parents and carers are welcome to join us as we will have this on the playground. We just ask parents to sign in with the QR Code that will be around the playground. Our ceremony is on Tuesday so that we can have some special visitors to the school.



Children are encouraged to wear their parents/grandparents dress medals if they wish.

Unfortunately, we are unable to march as a school this year. 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SCHOOL PHOTOS Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> March



School photos will be taken on Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> March. All children, will need to be in their **full winter uniform**, including ties for the boys and the tie tabs for the girls. Girls can wear either navy tights or ankle length white socks and all boys should be in trousers **not shorts** with navy school socks. Boys can wear short sleeve or long sleeve shirts. Girls can have Navy/Gold/ Royal Blue ribbons. Black leather school shoes not runner should also be worn.

Can I take this opportunity to remind parents that earring for boys is not part of our school uniform nor are hair styles with undercuts, stripes or zigzags or 'number one/two' all over shaves.

This year's photos will be taken similarly to pre-COVID, with class groups, family groups (if wanted) and individual photos. All photos are pre-ordered/payment and an individual photo envelope will be sent home for all students in the next week or so. These envelope are individually coded for each child and need to be returned on the day of the photos.

### **School Uniforms**

As stated in the newsletter last term students have until **Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> May** to be in their full winter uniform. This week and next week (apart from Thursday as indicated above), students can be in either their full winter or summer uniform depending on the weather. From Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> all students should be in their full winter uniform.

### School Concert - Tuesday 20 July

We are going to go ahead and plan for the school concert this year. I have changed the date though until Tuesday 20<sup>th</sup> July, Week 2 Term 3. It will be quite different from previous years and will likely be in two parts – Infants and Primary, to allow for COVID number restrictions in St Edwards Hall. ### Welcome to Term 2

This year Pope Francis proclaimed 2021 a "Year of Saint Joseph" commemorating the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church.

In a Apostolic Letter entitled <u>**Patris corde</u>** ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis describes Saint Joseph as a beloved father, a tender and loving father, an obedient father, an accepting father; a father who is creatively courageous, a working father, a father in the shadows.</u>

The Pope wrote *Patris corde* against the backdrop of the Covid -19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of "ordinary" people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this,



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they resemble Saint Joseph, "the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence," who nonetheless played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation." Happiness for Joseph involved a true gift of self, something all parents can relate to as they take up the daily responsibility of caring for their children.

Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary. To you God entrusted his only Son; in you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man.

Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us grace, mercy, and courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.

This term there are many liturgies to look forward to, including Anzac Day, Mothers' Day, 200 Years of Catholic Education Mass, The Feast of the Sacred Heart to name a few. Thankfully with the easing of Covid Restrictions, we are now able to come and celebrate together.

**Confirmation** - Many students will also be receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation this term on 6<sup>th</sup> June. We keep these students in our prayers as they begin their sacramental classes. All Parents are reminded that there is a confirmation information night next Wednesday April 28 which you are expected to attend.

Huge congratulations to our very own Cooper S, who is part of the Central Coast Marlins Little League baseball team. The team of 10-11 year old's won the title of '2021 Little League NSW Country State Champions' which was during the school holidays. They therefore qualified for the National Championships to be held in Lismore in June 2021, to play teams from all over Australia.

This is the second time in the history of the tournament in Australia that a team from Central Coast Marlins Baseball has qualified for the National Championships. Many of the other players in the team attend other Central Coast Catholic Schools.

Cooper pitched during the game against Newcastle and saved his best hit of the tournament until the grand final, where the Marlins narrowly defeated Illawarra 5-4, in a close game that went the full 6 innings.
