I wonder how it works?


What does fine motor look like at home?

Using material such as stacking blocks and Lego pieces, children are using strength and skills to push and connect pieces through grasping, holding and pinching. Putting on shoes, buttoning clothes, doing up zippers and cleaning teeth are home activities that slowly refine motor skills.


The frontal lobe of the brain controls movement.


The more the fine motor skills are practiced and developed, the faster the neurons are strengthened. Any types of play can help!























What does child initiated play look like

NO BAKE PLAYDOUTH RECIPE



Easy No Bake Play-doh!

Ingredients

2 Cups Plan flour

1 cup salt

1 tbsp. oil

1 cup cold water

2 drops liquid food coloring (any color of your choice!)

Method

Step 1: Combine plain flour and salt

<u>Step 2</u>: Add water, food coloring and oil. Mix until ingredients are combined

Step 3: Knead Well.

Step 4: If consistency is too wet add a little plain flour.

Step 5: Enjoy!!!!!

Playdough can be made as individual portions or make one large batch and separate. Add colouring to the playdough or glitter. Essential oils can be added for aroma.

Playdough can be used in so many ways. It originally only came in white and was invented as a cleaning product! Red is the most popular colour.




CAN YOU STICK DOTS ON THE LINE...CAN YOU MAKE A PATTERN?

Or trace shapes using stickers




FOLLOWING INSTRUCTIONS TO MAKE A GLASS WINDOW SHAPE

- 2. Place a piece of clear contact on one side.
- 3. Chip small pieces of tissue paper using a few different colours.
- 4. Stick the tissue paper on the contact.
- 5. Place another piece contact on top of the paper when finished decorating.





Children love using puppets and props to retell a story. The visual prop helps to increase confidence, motivation and oral language.

Often there is a process to follow to get a great result.




