Week 9

Be vigilant at all times: Luke 21

Each year, we begin the new liturgical year with a four-week celebration of Advent. The word Advent comes from **adventus**, a Latin word which means arrival, coming or presence of someone or some event. Advent is our season of beginning which focuses on waiting. The scripture reminds us to actively wait for the coming of the Lord as king at the end-time.

For many people, waiting is that place between where we are and where we want to be. We wait at the doctor's office. We wait in traffic. We wait in line at the coffee shop. We wait our turn. We do not enjoy such a place. We want to move out of it and do something worthwhile. Advent reminds us to be patient as we wait on the Lord. In the meantime, we are encouraged to look back over our life to see how we have prepared a place for Christ to be born again in our lives and in the lives of those whom we love. We are watchful and alert! While we are waiting, come Lord Jesus!

Last Sunday's Gospel from St Luke reminded us to be "vigilant at all times," to not let the anxieties of life cause us to become weary as we wait for the Lord's return. Let this season of Advent be a time of change and new beginnings, a time of looking beyond ourselves, expanding our mind and heart in order to open ourselves up to the needs of other people, and to the desire for a new world. Let it be a time of joy and a time of hope for each of us.

We pray during Advent that we may open our hearts in love and hope as we await the celebration of Jesus' birth.

Central Coast Discernment Project

Dear St Patrick's School Community - You might have heard about the 'Central Coast Project' happening across our diocese. Link to video outlining the project: <https://www.bbcatholic.org.au/our-faith/pastoral-discernment-central-coast>. The first step is at our School level with a 'listening journey' around particular themes: walking, sharing, listening, participating in mission, dialogue with others, and moving forward together. We have had Plenary Council parish gatherings with its discernment journey to the Australian Council of Bishops which will be moving forward with the Holy Spirit to 2023. This project is much more local in terms of the recommendations that will be shaped through our Pastoral Discernment submission. The project aligns with Bishop Anthony's six priorities for our Diocese and are outlined in his pastoral letter December 2020 - <https://www.bbcatholic.org.au/about/bishop/pastoral-letter-jesus-christ-our-beginning-and-end>.

The project will begin with listening and discernment within our School. Lee Sullivan and team extend an invitation to our community to listen to their thoughts about strategies for evangelisation, parish renewal and discipleship, ensuring a sustainable and thriving community, celebrating what we are doing well and what might the future look like for our Church on the Central Coast. Bishop Anthony is eagerly awaiting our thoughts, and we are invited to shape our Parish Submission, which is due by end March 2022. Watch this space for opportunities to get involved and share your thoughts during February and March 2022. I will outline with you over the coming weeks how we as a School Community will progress the plan for our submission. Please keep this work in your prayers.

Dear Parishioners,

Over the last three years at St Patrick's Parish we have had opportunities to reflect on different themes which have been important for both our parish and our personal lives. During this Year of Community I would like to encourage you all to make even more effort to become involved in our community life, to make an extra effort to build new relationships and friendships within the parish. Or even to make extra effort to come to church every Sunday and attend other parish events.

Together with the parish staff and many amazing volunteers from the parish I will start some new projects and initiatives, and you are welcome to be a part of them too. This is to help make this year an opportunity for everyone who already comes to our church, and also for those who are still to make the choice to come, to feel more welcome, appreciated, and that they belong.

I would also like to focus your attention on three new committees I have created in the parish: they are the Community Dinner, Liturgy and Evangelisation committees. These will help us to build an even better and stronger community at St Patrick's and improve our liturgical celebrations, but also reach out to people in Gosford and the Central Coast area with the invitation and opportunity to reconnect with God, His Church, and our parish.

There are many different ways to develop relationships with others in our parish. Whether you are involved in a ministry team, small group, Bible study, or other group, we are called to develop close relationships with others so that we may encourage one another, pray for one another, build one another up, and hold one another accountable as followers of Christ. Don't run the Christian race alone. Let's run together as one community, one parish, one family and one body of Christ. Let's make this Year of Community a special time for everyone!

FROM OUR SACRAMENTAL CO-ORDINATOR

Families of children making their Sacraments in 2022 should be advised that Confirmation will take place on **Sunday 29th May**, for candidates who have already been baptised. The Parent Information Evening is compulsory to attend and will be held at 7pm on **Tuesday 26th April** (the first day of Term 2!) Following that evening there will be four weeks of preparation classes with a choice of days and times so there will be something to suit all families.

For children who have already been confirmed, we are trying something new next year, combining the Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist in one preparation period, with 6 weeks of combined prep culminating in a rehearsal in the church and then a Reconciliation service on **Wednesday 14th September** at 6pm, followed by First Eucharist masses on **Sunday 18th September**. The Parent Information Evening for these Sacraments is compulsory to attend and will be held at 7pm on **Wednesday 27th July**.

Please put these dates in next year's diaries to avoid clashes, and more information on enrolment and preparation classes will be forthcoming early in 2022. Looking forward to welcoming you and your children to the Sacramental Program, or welcoming you back!

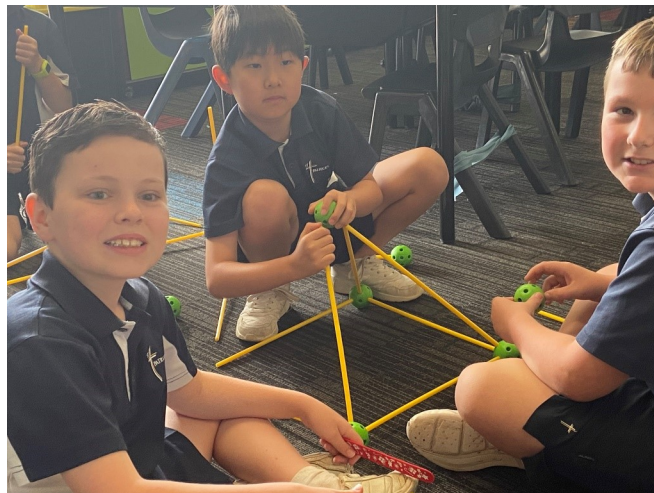
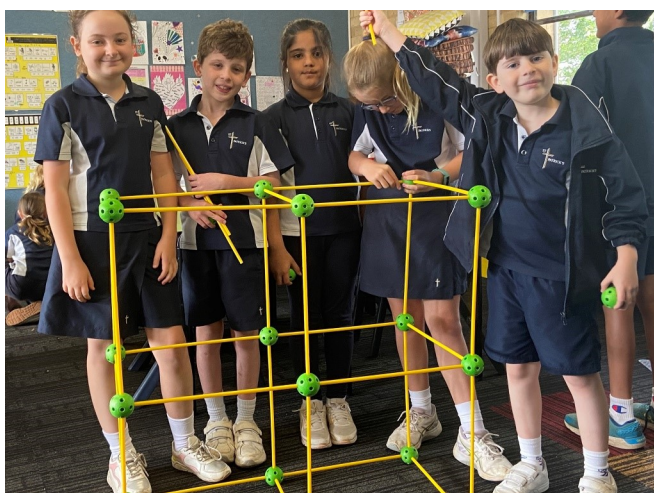
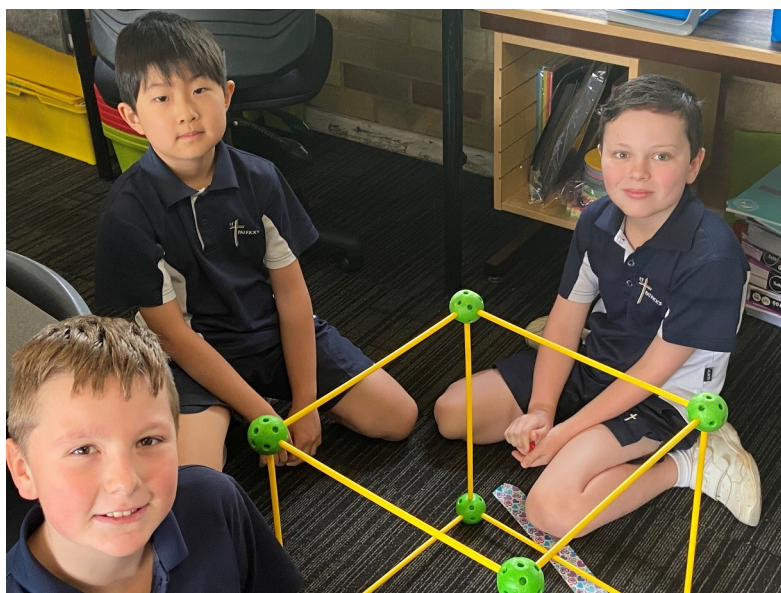
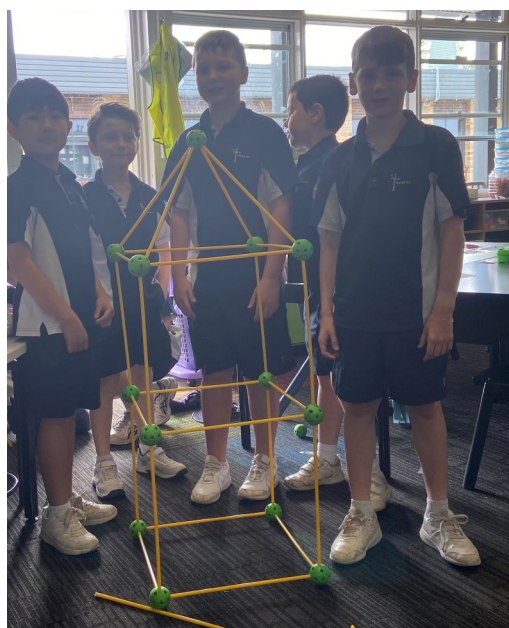
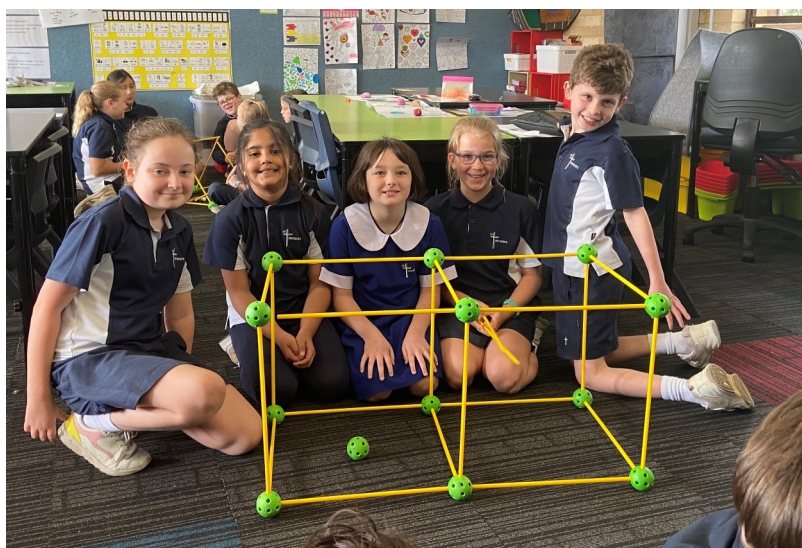
Book Fair

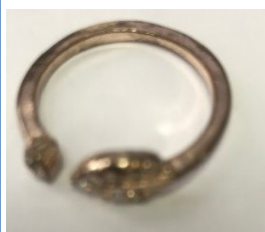
