
The Infants Cross Country date will be sent to parents once we have this finalised.



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Palm Sunday – Passion Sunday

This Sunday, called Palm or Passion Sunday, is the first day of Holy Week.

Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday are called the Triduum, three days that are the highlight of the Church year. Jesus triumphant entry into Jerusalem is reported in each of the four Gospels. But in Luke's gospel there are no palms. Luke mentions only that people spread their cloaks on the road as Jesus

entered Jerusalem. The cloak was the most valuable item of clothing one could possess, and many people only had one cloak. In placing their cloaks on the ground before Jesus they were offering all they had to the messiah king, entrusting themselves totally to him.

On this Palm Sunday we are invited to follow the example of Jesus and empty ourselves, embracing true humility. We are invited to remove the cloaks of comfort and self-absorption to take on Christ's spirit of humility and selflessness.

Throughout Holy Week, we continue to reflect on the events of Jesus' passion and death. On Holy Thursday we reflect upon the last meal Jesus shared with his apostles. On Good Friday we remember the crucifixion and death of Jesus. Holy Saturday is a vigil where we keep watch for the expectant rising of Jesus. On Easter Sunday we celebrate the resurrection of Jesus. I would encourage you check the church website/bulletin for times and to try and attend some of these ceremonies which fall in the middle weekend of the holidays.

Holy Week Liturgy



Yesterday Australian religious singer and songwriter Andrew Chinn led us in a reverent liturgy reflecting of the events of Holy Week. Andrew has his own website : Butterfly house and many school including St Patrick's use his music in liturgies and in the classroom. Yesterday's liturgy reminded us of the sacrifice Jesus made to bring salvation to all of us. Thank you to Andrew and our

students for bringing to life the real message of Easter.

Project Compassion Fundraising



Donut Day on Tuesday organised by our captains and the SRC was the last of the fundraising for Project Compassion. It is amazing how enthusiastic and generous the students have been with their time and effort to help the Ukrainians, the flood victims and the many vulnerable people

in the world, including Australia, who need our help and support. They really embraced the spirit of almsgiving and took to heart the Caritas theme: "Help create change for all future generations. End poverty, promote justice, uphold dignity."

Altogether we raised \$541 for Project compassion. A mammoth effort St Patrick's which exemplifies to the full the easter message of Pope Francis.

"Jesus, the Risen Lord, loves us without limits and is there at every moment of our lives," the Pope said. "Having made himself present in the heart of our world, he invites us to overcome barriers, banish prejudices and draw near to those around us every day in order to rediscover the *grace of everyday life*.

"Your expectations will not remain unfulfilled, your tears will be dried, your fears will be replaced by hope. For the Lord goes ahead of you, he walks before you. And, with him, life begins anew."
